Arlington, VA -- The U.S. Trade and Development Agency announces the appointment of Enoch T. Ebong as the Agency's new Deputy Director. Ms. Ebong will help lead the Agency's efforts to link U.S. businesses to global infrastructure opportunities.

Since joining USTDA in 2004, Ms. Ebong has served in several capacities, including acting Regional Director for sub-Saharan Africa, Deputy General Counsel and General Counsel. As the Agency's chief legal officer, Ms. Ebong provided authoritative legal advice and direction on all program and operations activities; represented USTDA in connection with matters affecting the Agency; and provided legal guidance to the Director on broad issues related to the mission, strategic direction and effectiveness of the Agency.

Prior to joining USTDA, Ms. Ebong practiced law at the Boston office of Mintz, Levin, Cohn, Ferris, Glovsky and Popeo, P.C. in the area of business and finance. Her practice included the representation of public and private companies, with an emphasis on financing transactions for both start-ups and established businesses; mergers and acquisitions; and corporate governance issues.

Ms. Ebong received her undergraduate degree from The University of Edinburgh, and her Master of Arts in Communication from the Annenberg School for Communication at the University of Pennsylvania. She received her J.D. from the University of Michigan Law School.
